HOLLYWOOD ACTORS AND WRITERS STRIKE

Streaming services such as Netflix, Disney+, etc have undoubtedly taken over the TV industry. Many writers and actors are claiming that the rise of streaming services has led to a decline in pay for writers and actors. This is because, despite the increase in profit from TV shows, the average pay for writers has reportedly decreased. The WGA (Writers Guild of America) put out a report demanding increased minimum compensation as well as increased pay in basically all areas of income, from residuals to insurance. They made these demands to a group called the AMPTP (The Alliance of Motion Picture and Television Producers) which is an association consisting of the top studios and streaming companies such as Sony, Universal, Disney, Netflix, etc. These demands ultimately led to negotiations between the two groups in late March. Fast forward to early May, after months of negotiations between the WGA and AMPTP, the two were still not able to come to an agreement on these matters which prompted a strike. Coincidentally, not too long after the start of the WGA strike, the SAG-AFTRA (Screen Actors Guild-American Federation of Television and Radio Artists) went on strike as well. Meaning that both writers and actors were going on strikes at the same time. The strikes have led many film and television productions to stop, which has even caused some studios to have to temporarily close down. As of today, the strikes are ongoing but signs of progress between unions and studios have been made.

F1 JAPANESE GRAND PRIX

On Sunday, September 24, Japan hosted the 17th Grand Prix of this season in Suzuka. It was no surprise that 2-Time World Champion Max Verstappen, who has been dominating this season, would take home first place. The Japanese trophy is especially popular with the fans for its unique kiss activation technology. When the winning driver kisses the trophy, it recognizes the driver's lip print and lights up their national colors. The race marked his 13th win this season and now with 400 points under his belt, he is just 3 points away from becoming the 2023 World Champion. Thanks to Verstappen, the Red Bull F1 Team has secured the 2023 Construction Championship with 623 points. Nonetheless, Red Bull wasn't the only winner of the Japanese Grand Prix, as McLaren managed to get a double podium. McLaren's Lando Norris and Oscar Piastri finished 2nd and 3rd respectively, which is Rookie Driver Oscar Piastri's first podium of his career.
